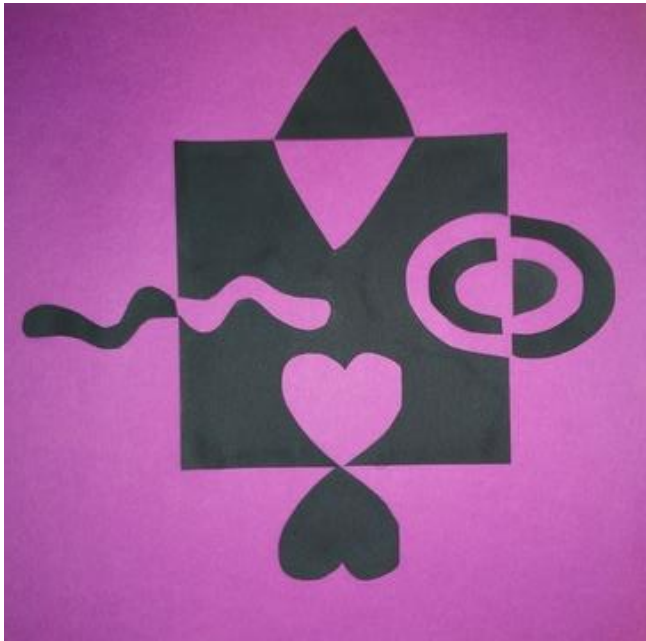
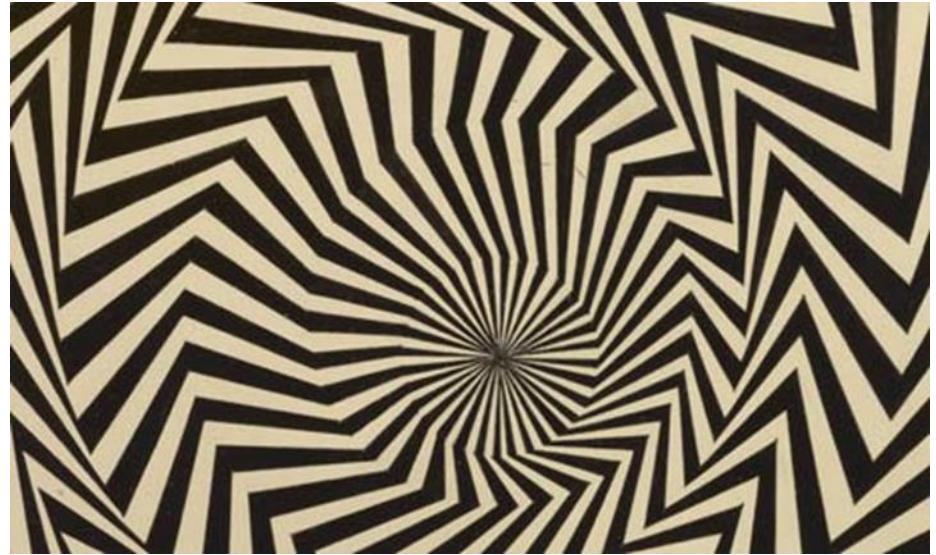


Op Art (Optical Art)

- Inspired by modern experiments in abstraction such as cubism, as well as technological advances in computers, television and aerospace

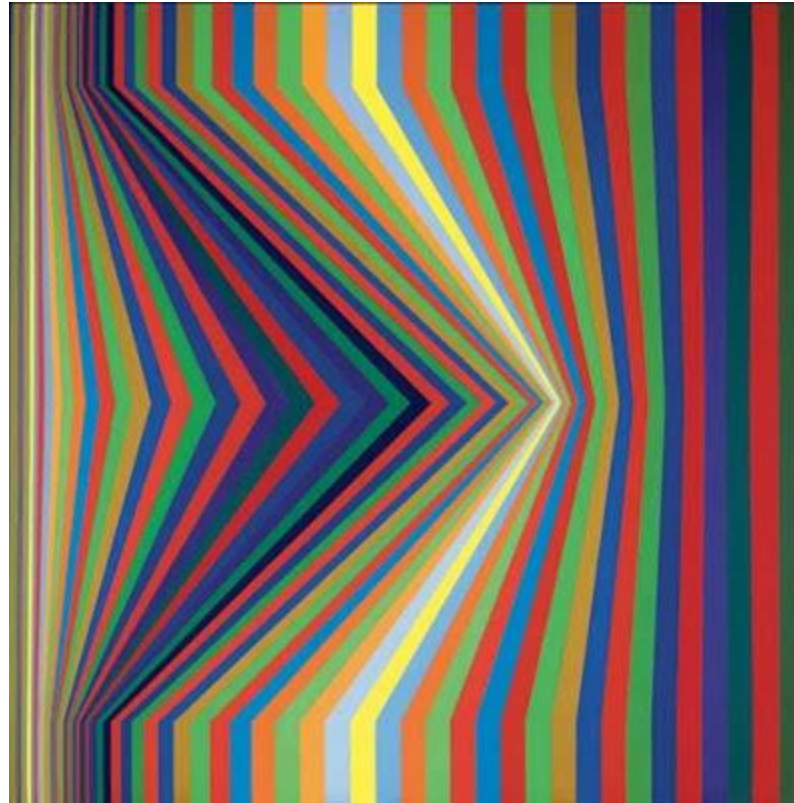


- Artists experimented with distorting the concepts of positive and negative space

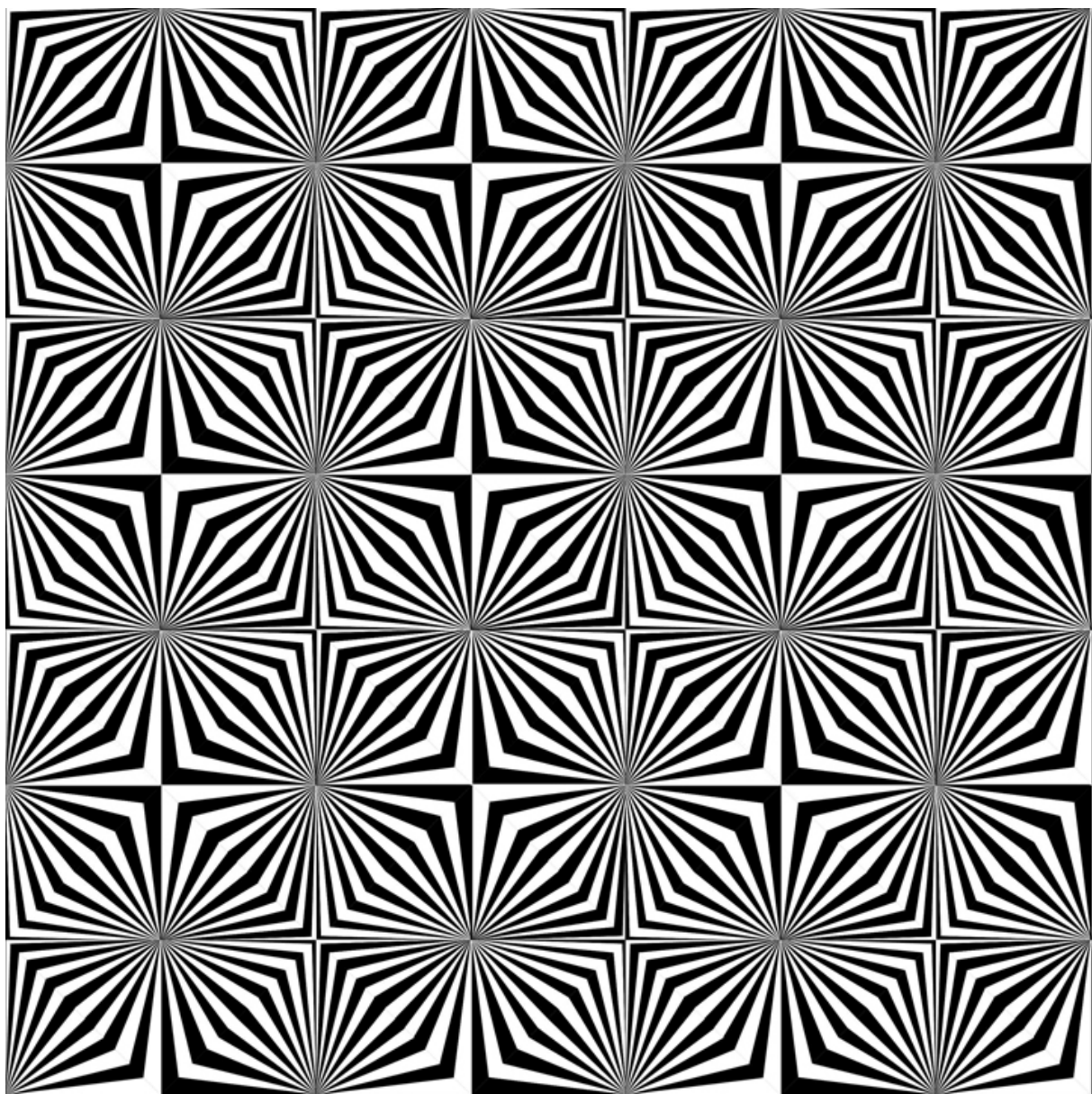


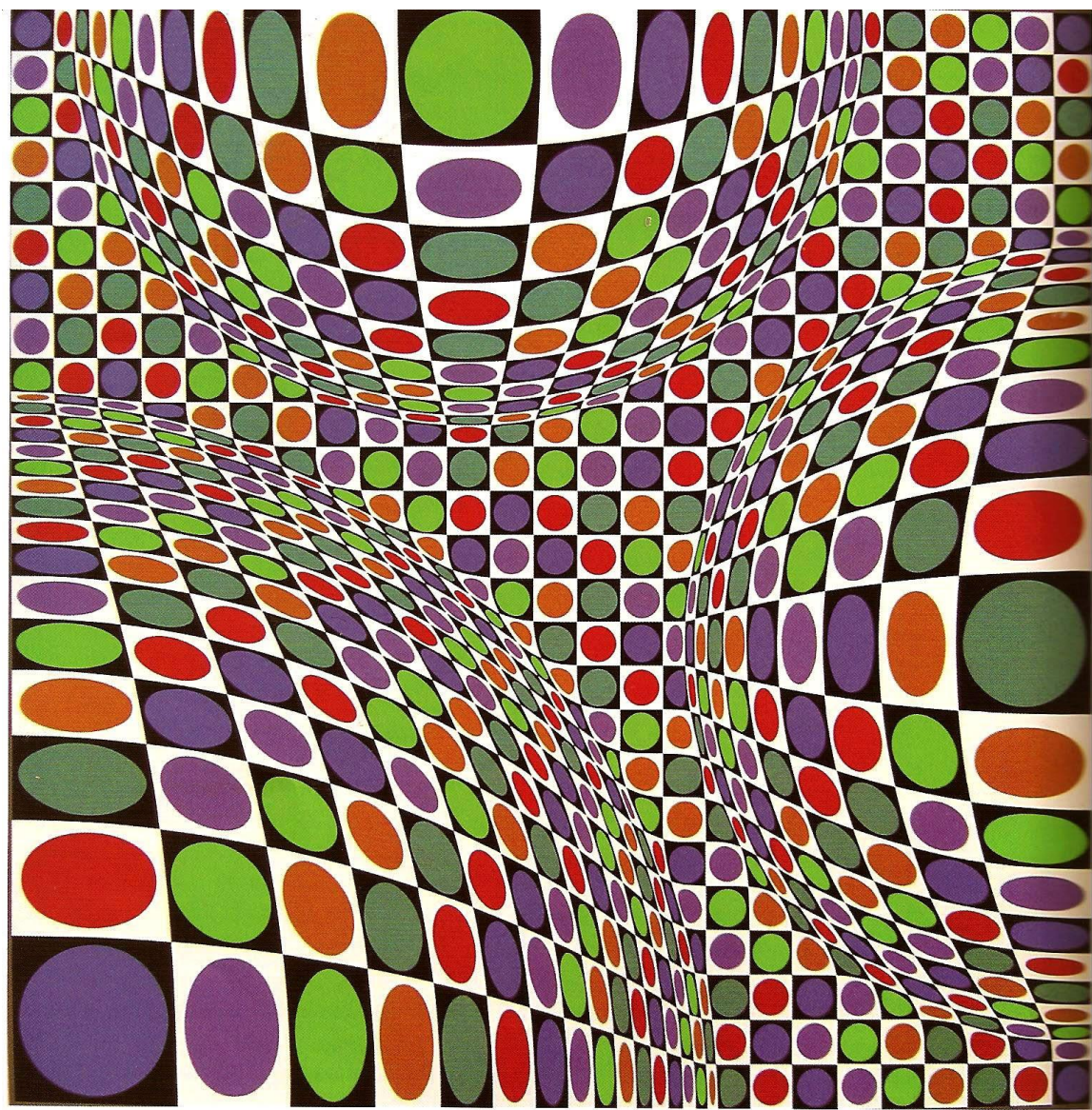
First Grade Art Project

- Artists would then combine color and abstract patterns to produce optical illusions

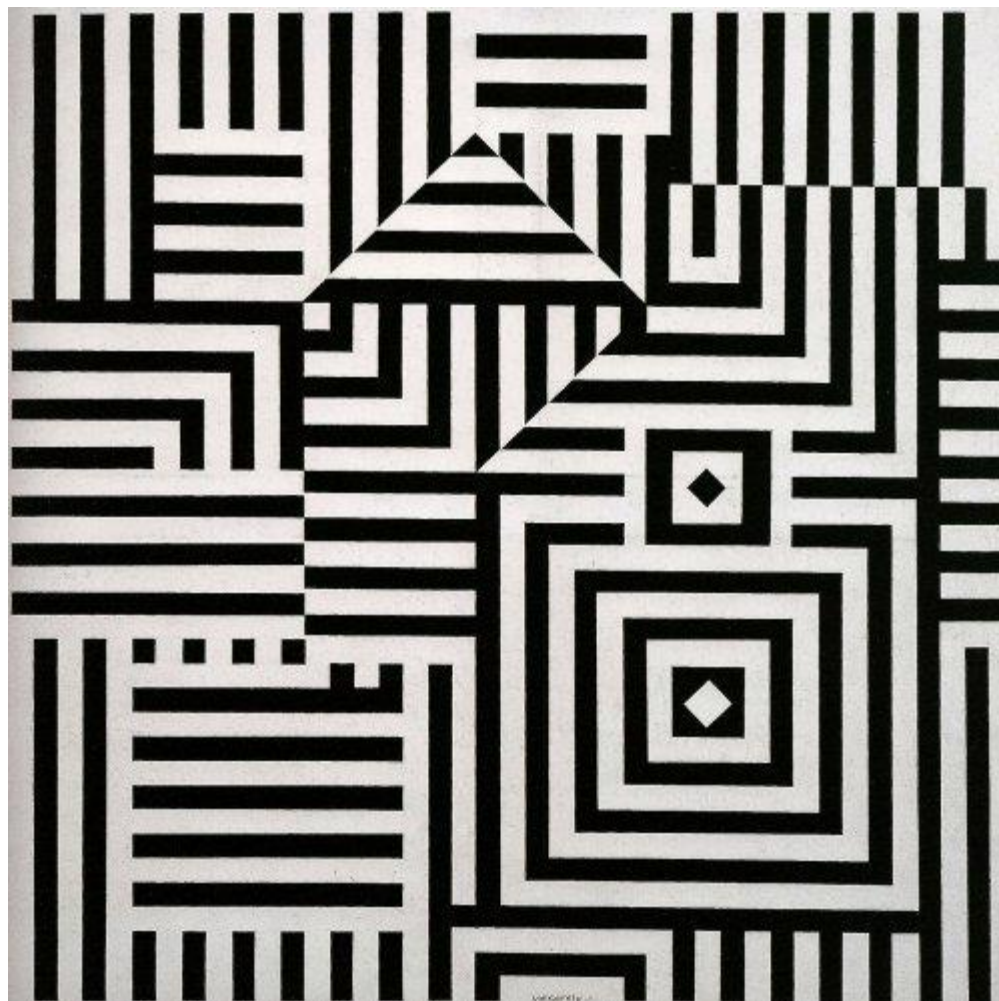


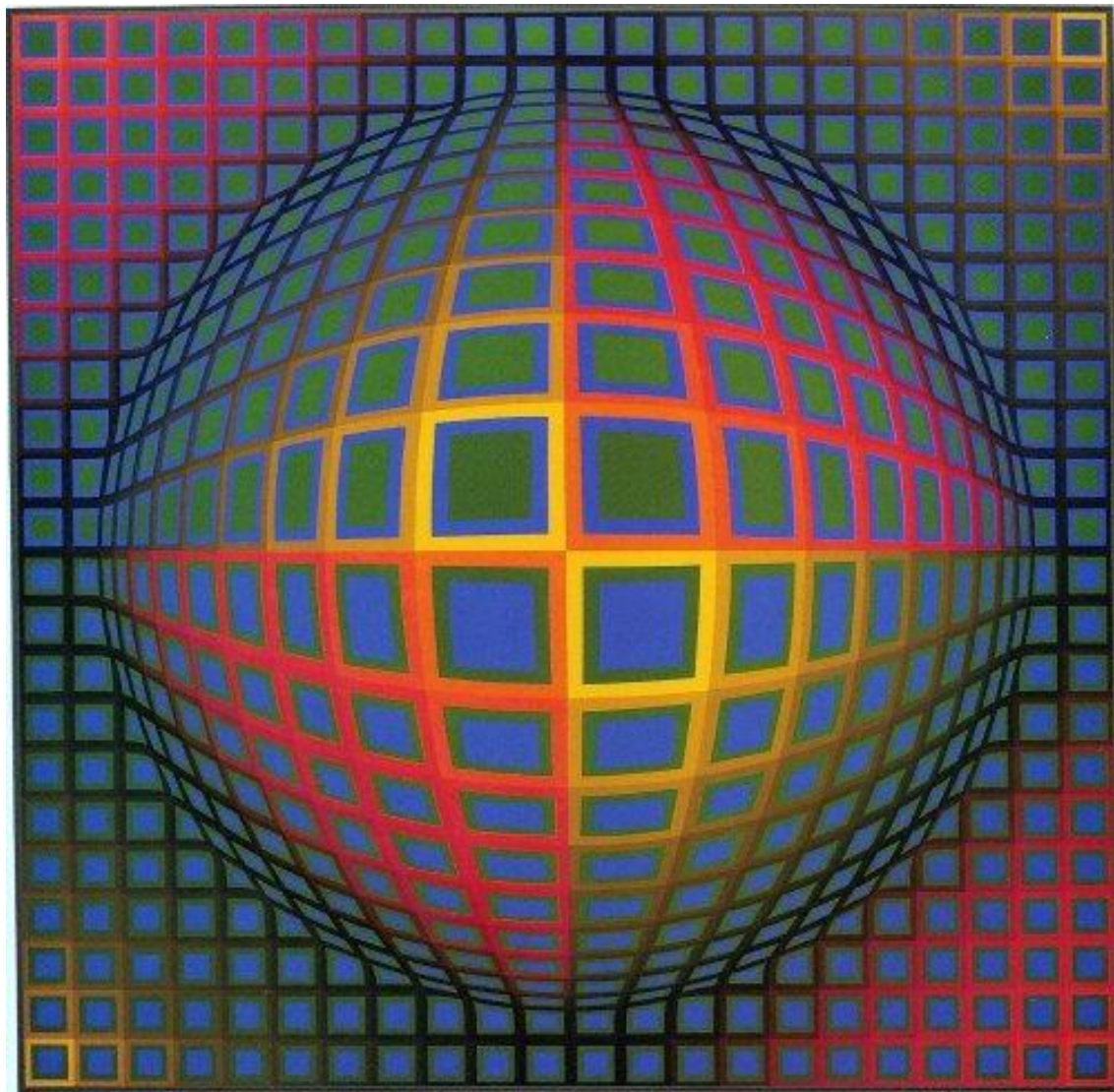
Remember that all these images are on a flat paper or canvas.

OPTICAL ILLUSION!

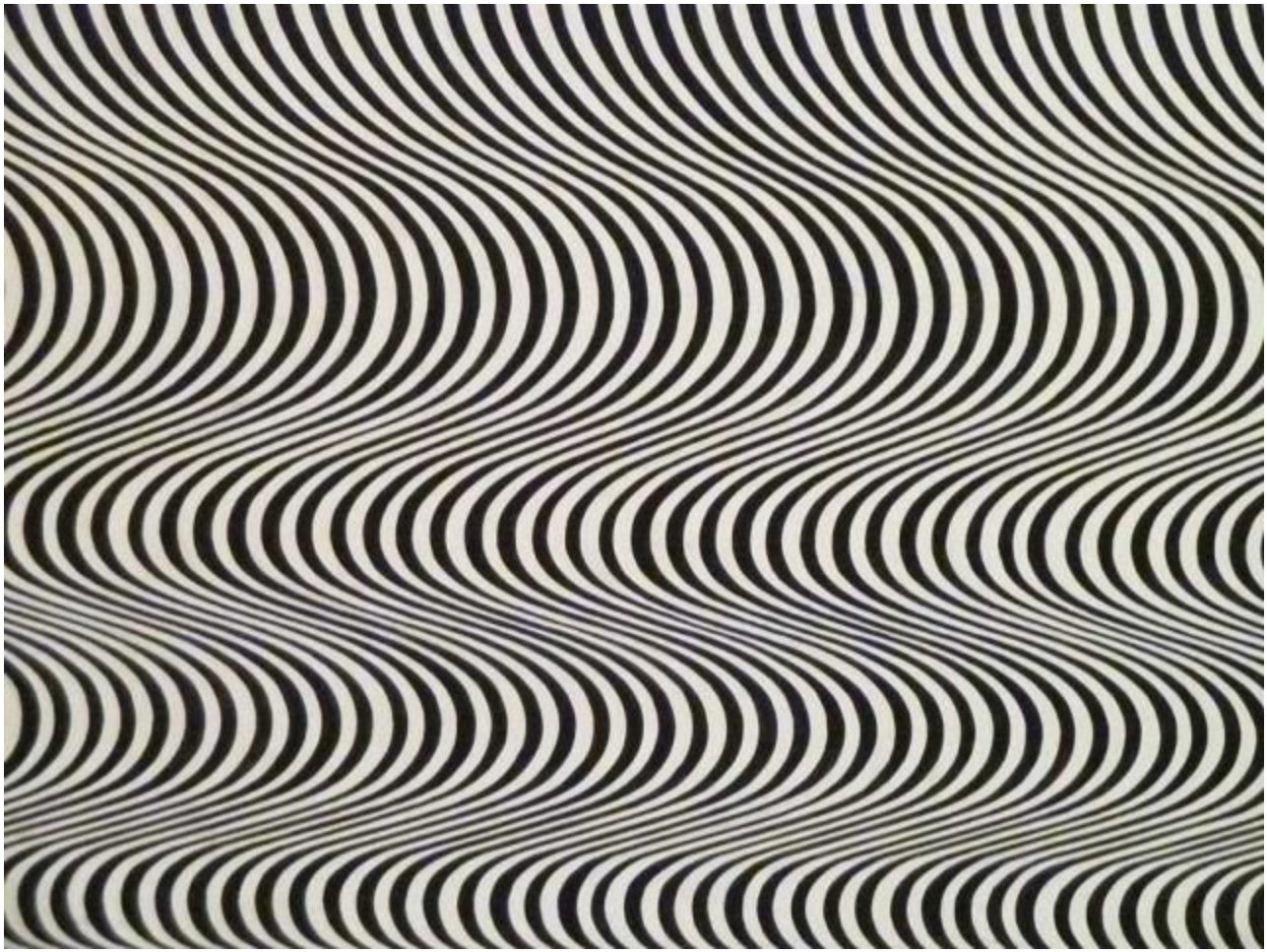


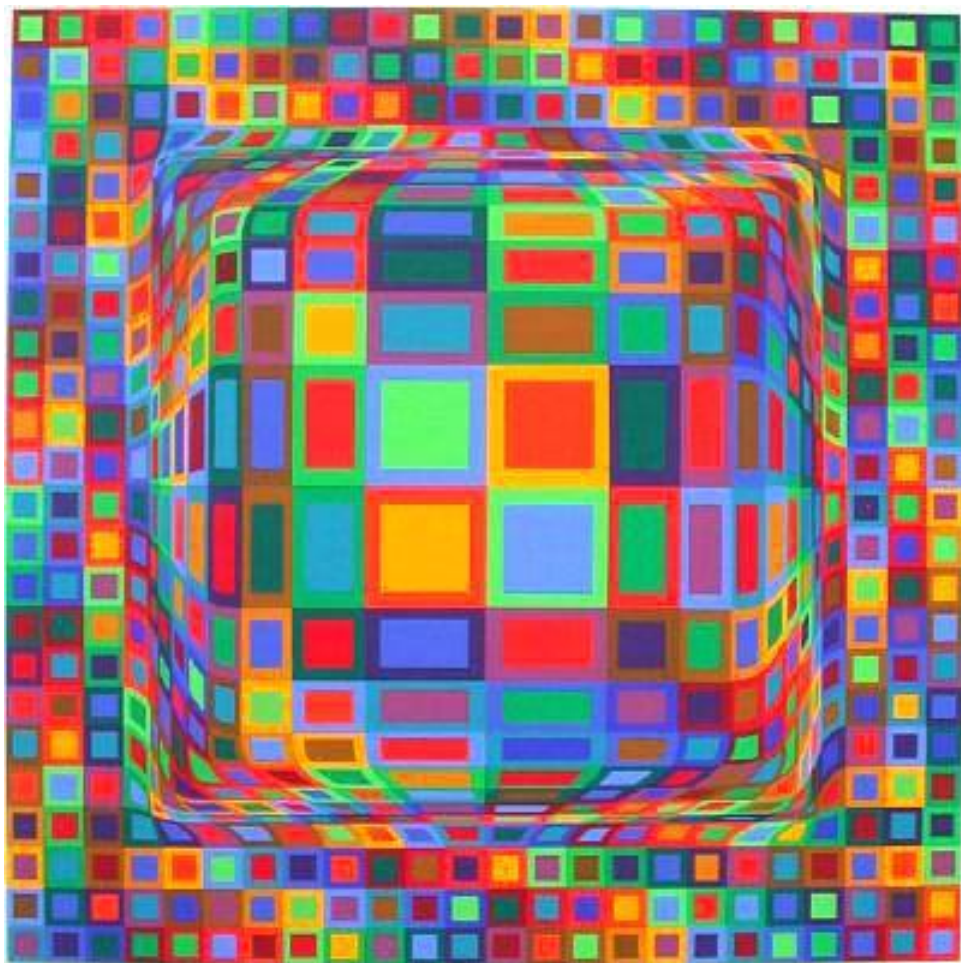


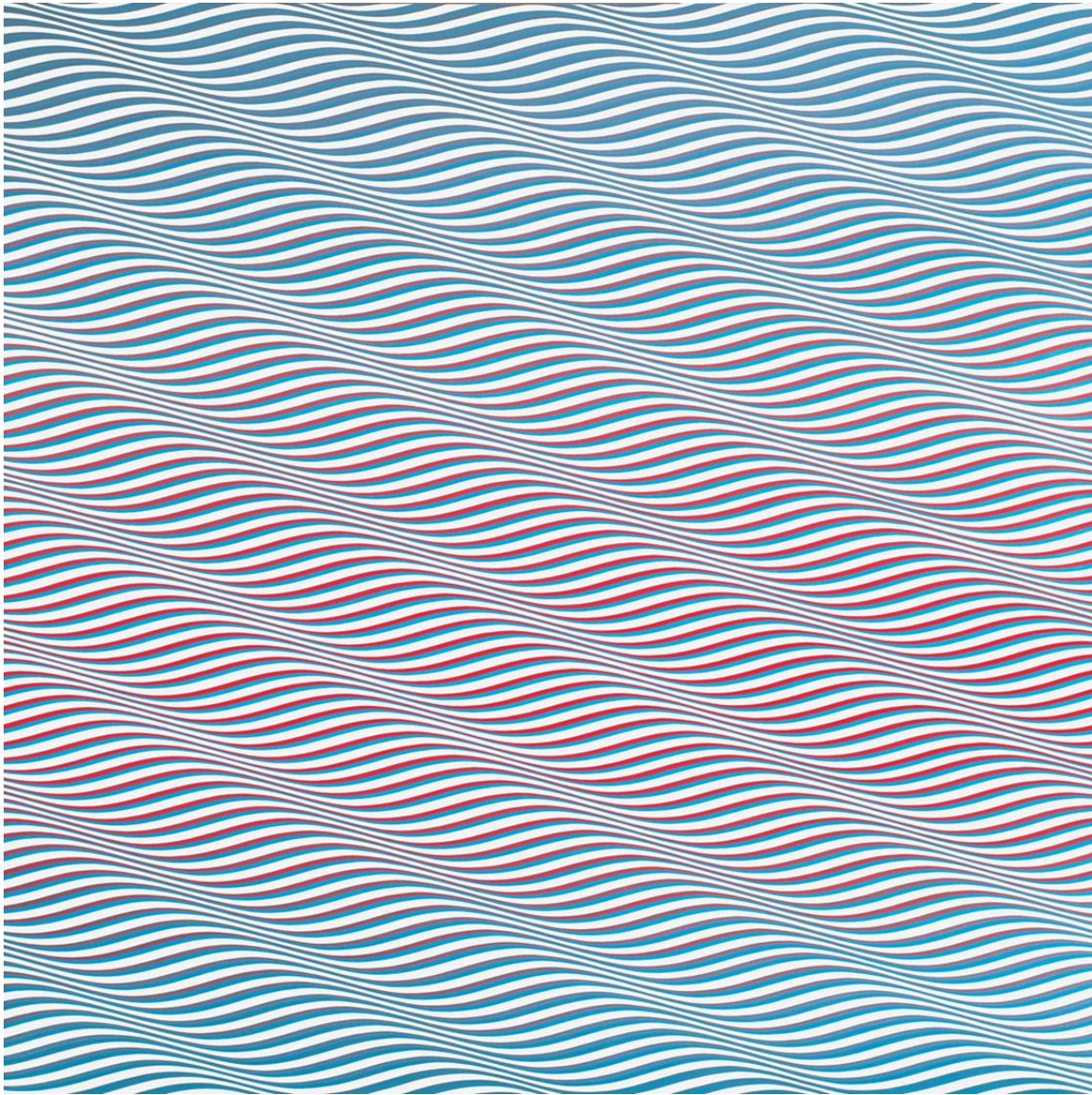
